The Kirby String Quartet draws its inspiration from the legendary comic book artist, Jack Kirby. Kirby's groundbreaking and dramatic style created "The Fantastic Four", and this quartet of strings aims to cultivate the same energy and passion in their concerts. The "Kirbies" joined forces in 2002 after having known each other and collaborated in different forms for over a decade. Each member of the Kirby Quartet brings unique skills and experiences to the group. Individually they perform, tour and record with world class ensembles such as Quartetto Gelato, I Furiosi Baroque Ensemble, Tafelmusik Baroque Orchestra, Eybler String Quartet, FLUX Quartet, Yo-Yo Ma's Silk Road Ensemble, and The Metropolitan Museum Artists in Concert, New York. Their work can be found on records from Sony, Analekta, Naxos, Dorian, CBC, Mode, and Tzadik, several of which have been nominated for Juno and Grammy Awards. They have performed all over the world, including extensive tours of North America, Europe and Asia.

The Kirby String Quartet is quickly establishing its place among Canada's top chamber ensembles. Jeanne Lamon, artistic director of Tafelmusik, declared a recent concert to be "the best musical listening experience I've had in many years!" They are an audience favourite at the Toronto Music Garden Concerts and Les Amis Concerts, and are the founding members of the Markham Street Chamber Concerts. In 2005 they were featured artists on CBC's "Music Around Us" recital series. The Kirbies tour the West Coast annually and 2008 will be their fourth consecutive summer workshop in Langley. Sharing a common aesthetic based on historical performance practice, the Kirby String Quartet puts their collective experience together for thought-provoking and daring performances.

Philosophy and Intent:

Chamber music is music making at its most intimate and inspiring. The challenges of listening to others, matching articulation, dynamics, sound colour, and communicating ideas, are complimented by the pure joy of becoming part of an ensemble and playing the greatest music ever written. This workshop introduces students to chamber music repertoire and rehearsal techniques, giving them the satisfaction that can be gained through this kind of musical collaboration.



Chamber Group Assignments:

In the first week of July, participants are assigned to chamber groups, and suitable repertoire is selected. All students are mailed copies of their chamber and orchestra music along with a CD of their pieces.

Workshop Details:

Each day of the workshop begins with participants and faculty joining the Kirby Quartet for a morning technique class or special presentation that addresses various aspects of musicianship. Late mornings and early afternoons are devoted to chamber group coaching and rehearsal sessions. In the late afternoon, the faculty and students collaborate in a conductorless chamber orchestra that explores a variety of chamber-oriented repertoire throughout the week. Pianists who prepare a movement of a Bach keyboard concerto may have the opportunity to work with the chamber orchestra, or will join other pianists in exploring the piano ensemble repertoire while the chamber orchestra is in session. Evenings are typically spent attending concerts, sightreading chamber music, or participating in other activities. This intensive week concludes with a final concert that showcases the chamber groups and chamber orchestra and allows participants to share their hard work with family and friends.

Who Should Apply?

Advanced string and piano students (grade 8 RCM and higher) of any age, who are interested in participating in an intense week of chamber music. Examples of repertoire representing this level of proficiency include:

Violin: Mozart G major concerto

Viola: Hoffmeister/Stamitz concertos

Cello: Haydn concertos, facility in thumb position,

ability to read tenor clef

Piano: Mozart/Beethoven Sonatas

Bach: Sinfonias or Well-Tempered Klavier

The workshop will be held on the Campus of Trinity Western University near Fort Langley in the beautiful Fraser Valley. The campus sits on 160 acres of fields, tennis courts, forests, trails and creeks.

Participants will have the option of living on campus or attending as day students. There are separate wings for boys and girls, and rooms are based on double occupancy, with shared bathrooms. Bedding and towels are to be provided by the students.

Participants under the age of 18 will be subject to a check-in procedure in the evening. A closely maintained residential environment will be provided by chaperones.
